Legislative Committee Meeting Minutes April 20, 2021

The April 20, 2021, remote Committee meeting was called to order by Chair Pious Ali at 8:02 AM on Zoom.

Councilor Pious Ali (Chair), Mayor Kate Snyder, Councilor Fournier, Jon Jennings (City Manager), Dena Libner (Chief of Staff), Frank Clark (Police Chief), Kate Knox (Bernstein Shur), and Chris Feeney (Bernstein Shur) were present.

Mayor Snyder made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from April 13, 2021, seconded by Councilor Fournier. Councilor Fournier proposed an amendment to the minutes in the section of LD 1278 to correct that Councilor Ali strongly supports the bill and recommends testimony in support of LD 1278. Motion to approve the minutes as amended made by Councilor Fournier, seconded by Councilor Ali, vote 3-0.

Chief Clark provided the committee with his feedback on **LD 1043** (*An Act Concerning the Unannounced Execution of Search Warrants*), which he supports; **LD 1127** (*An Act To Prohibit the Use of "No-knock" Warrants*), which he opposes; and **LD 1171** (*An Act To Curtail No-knock Warrants*), which he supports, but has questions about its practical application.

Mayor Snyder said that it sounds that the Chief is generally supportive of restrictions and asked the Chief for his thoughts about whether such changes are better made at a local or state level. Chief Clark said he prefers having the discretion to make the changes locally. He added that the City has been involved with two no-knock warrants in the last 18 months, both of which were MDEA warrants.

Mayor Snyder and Councilor Fournier expressed a desire to spend more time reviewing the above bills and staff feedback.

Kate Knox informed the committee about upcoming public hearings for **LD 50** (*An Act To Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue To Invest in Housing for Persons Who Are Homeless*) and

LD 175 (*An Act To Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue To Create and Enhance Regional Homeless Shelters*). Mr. Jennings expressed that both bills are a priority for the City and that they will work with Kate Knox to prepare testimony for both bills.

Kate Knox proceeded to review the list of new bills with the Committee. Regarding **LD 1478** (*An Act To Decriminalize Homelessness*), Mayor Snyder said she likes the idea of positive intervention but worries about the requirement of substance abuse or mental health intervention having to happen before we have the opportunity to respond to something that may be an illegal act. She is disinclined to support the bill at this time because she worries that an illegal act will have the opportunity to escalate beyond what is safe. City laws and ordinances need to be enforced parallel to mental health and substance abuse support.

Councilor Fournier would like to have Chief Clark present for a larger discussion of **LD 1478** (*An Act To Decriminalize Homelessness*). Mr. Jennings expressed his disapproval of **LD 1478**, and said the proposal of the creation of a two-tier system of justice is problematic.

Councilor Ali requested information regarding **LD 987** (*An Act To Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue for the Portland Harbor Commercial Revitalization Project's Confined Aquatic Disposal Cell and Dredging Projects*). Chris Feeney confirmed that no hearing has been scheduled, and Mr. Jennings indicated staff's strong support.

Mayor Snyder made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilor Fournier, vote 3-0. The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 AM.

Hello Chair Ali, Mayor Kate Snyder, Councilor Fournier and Councilor Mavodones,

I'm writing to you about LD 1478, An Act to Decriminalize Homelessness.

The behaviors LD 1478 seeks to decriminalize for unhoused people, while perhaps seen as minor to some of you, are overwhelmingly concentrated in one historically marginalized neighborhood. Cumulatively, crimes of disorder have a tremendous negative and long-term impact on individuals, families and children, businesses, previously homeless residents, *and* people experiencing homelessness.

This bill would excessively and unfairly burden those who live and operate businesses in the vicinity of Portland's oversaturated cluster of social services emergency homeless shelters. This is not a judgement – the data show that crimes of disorder, property crime, and violent crime are all overrepresented here. Each feeds the other. At the start of the pandemic when the courts closed, it didn't take long for people to realize citations, arrests and prosecutions would be limited; the chaos level increased. This bill would make that change permanent.

Police would be prohibited from serving the entire community equally. As I understand the bill, they could not act to remove people loitering, sitting or camping on a sidewalk outside of a residence, business, or, ironically, an emergency shelter, even if those persons are creating a disturbance by way of fighting, drug use, drinking, urinating, excessive noise, etc. Exhaling toxic smoke into a residence and refusing to stop or move along would be okay. Intentionally urinating on a restaurant window at the customers on the other side would be acceptable as long as genitals aren't seen. Someone camping on a sidewalk couldn't be made to move along even if handicapped pedestrians

are forced to go around by walking in the street. All the examples above are based on lived experiences, and there are many, many more.

LD 1478's sponsors ignore that Portland's police, the officers who interact most frequently with the state's unhoused population, already have many protocols and effective approaches for responding to people experiencing homelessness. The PPD works very closely with social service providers and agencies; they have liaisons and community policing coordinators on staff to keep people connected and aware of programs; and they guide them toward available resources. But not everyone is ready or willing to access those resources, or cease their disruptive behavior.

This bill would take away one of the few tools available for managing those situations, and excessively and unfairly impact the residents and businesses in an area that has for years been the center of disorderly and criminal activity. When used properly, enforcement can and does have a positive impact – drug courts, deferred dispositions, alternative sentencing, community service, restorative justice, and other methods can connect people with resources and options while simultaneously respecting the needs and legal rights of the surrounding community.

This bill is well intentioned, but the consequences will exacerbate the harm already being done to a vulnerable neighborhood and not change much by way of connecting people with support. It sends the terrible message that no one expects much of you if you don't have a home, and the needs of the rest of the neighborhood don't matter a whole lot either. Legalizing fighting, drinking, drug use, public urination, blocking public ways, etc would further erode Bayside's already marginal quality of life.

I very much agree that it's important for people in precarious situations to be supported in progress they may be making. I've personally gone to court to speak up for an unhoused person who stole from me; engaged in restorative justice; and when possible I politely ask people to move along, or ask officers to simply have a conversation with disorderly people, rather than cite or arrest them. I know many people's stories, and don't want to see them pulled off-course for a mistake, relapse, or behavior they have a hard time controlling. But lawlessness is not compassionate for anyone.

Should you find yourself leaning toward supporting this bill, please discuss whether it would stand up to challenges from communities where most of the impact would be felt; consider whether it would make our streets more or less safe for anyone, housed or unhoused; and think long and hard about whether you would want it passed if you and your family lived in Bayside. If in the future the super-concentration of shelters is reduced this bill might be worth revisiting, but not until then.

Good morning, Senator Deschambault, Representative Warren and distinguished members of the Committee on Criminal Justice & Public Safety: On behalf of the City of Portland, I am offering our support for LD 759, *An Act To Amend the Child Endangerment Laws To Include Certain Unauthorized Access to a Loaded Firearm*.

The bill before you simply seeks to address and enhance gun safety, period. Every year, nearly 350 juveniles unintentionally shoot themselves or someone else. This bill's goals are to protect children from obtaining and using a loaded firearm that would increase the chances of such a discharge that could result in injury or death. This is an important statewide policy discussion, and one that should be aimed at both reducing inappropriate youth access and education as well.

Although it could be argued that such conduct could be construed as criminal under existing general state statute, this act would clarify that intent and make it clear that such recklessness, *only when it results in the actual reckless use, or the use of the firearm during the commission of a crime, or the reckless or negligent discharge of the firearm*, is a crime. It also provides a number of affirmative defenses intended to allow for a balance and reasonableness assessment, and the protection of gun owners who act safely or have no reason to think a child may access a firearm in their home.

Responsible gun owners can make our homes and communities safer. Although millions of responsible gun owners follow recommended storage practices, a 2016 study indicated that half do not. A 2020 study, *The Science of Gun Policy*, found that child access prevention laws, such as this, can impact unintentional firearm injuries and deaths, as well as firearm self-injuries, suicides and non-self-inflicted injuries among our youth.

In summary, I ask that you vote in support of LD 759. Thank you for your time and consideration.

Senator Breen, Representative Pierce, and members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on behalf of the City of Portland in support of L.D. 987, ***"An Act To Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue for the Portland Harbor Commercial Revitalization Project's Confined Aquatic Disposal Cell and Dredging Projects."***

A recent economic assessment estimates ***the value of Portland Harbor***, including the total economic output of marine commerce and indirect marine and non-marine businesses, at approximately ***\$ 1 billion dollars per year***. Commercial fishing, marine transportation, tourism, and recreation coexist and prosper at the mouth of the Fore River between the cities of Portland and South Portland. Portland Harbor is Maine's biggest port and is an economic engine of state-wide significance.

Fundamentally, all port communities rely on safe vessel berthing to remain viable. Such berthing needs shelter from storms, access to upland transportation and services, and adequate water depth at low tide to serve the vessel. Vessel berthing is the foundation of marine commerce. Unfortunately, ***berthing in Portland harbor is shrinking and at continuous risk due to sedimentation and pollution***.

All urban harbors experience natural drainage and storm water runoff which deposit sediments along piers, wharfs and marinas resulting in a loss of water depth and reduced access for vessels. In Portland's Central Waterfront, home to the fishing fleet and tourism fleet, ***over 3000 linear feet of commercial berthing has been lost*** – a 26% loss - with much more having degraded due to lost water depth. Comparable losses can be seen in most portions of the harbor.

The only solution for continual sedimentation is dredging. Virtually all urban harbors require dredging eventually and the ***berthing resources of Portland Harbor have not been dredged in***

decades. Legacy industries and ongoing non-point source pollution contaminate Fore River sediments, complicating dredged sediment disposal and degrading the environmental health of the harbor.

The US Army Corps of Engineers has responsibility for dredging the federal navigation channel but is statutorily prohibited from dredging outside of the designated channel. Public and private pier and property owners are typically responsible for maintaining facility water depth, but the Fore River's **contaminated sediments preclude economically feasible disposal options**. Urban harbors elsewhere in New England, including Boston and New Bedford, MA, Providence, RI, and New London, CT have successfully utilized Confined Aquatic Disposal (CAD) cells to address similar problems. CAD cells are deeply dredged basins constructed within urban harbors into which contaminated sediments are deposited and sequestered. A CAD cell in Portland Harbor will allow dredging that will restore and maintain marine access; and, will additionally clean Portland Harbor by removing pollution. **CAD technology has a proven track record** and a feasible and attractive location has been identified for a CAD cell in Portland Harbor.

Working collaboratively with US EPA Brownfields, State of Maine DOT, the Portland Harbor Commission, and the Cities of Portland and South Portland, the **Portland Harbor Commercial Revitalization Project** has progressed significantly toward implementation. The dredge locations have been identified and the total volume of sediment for removal has been estimated. A disposal site for a CAD cell has been identified and proven viable. 30% design drawings for **both dredge and disposal have been approved for environmental permitting** with the State of Maine and nearly so with the the US Army Corps of Engineers (the CAD cell has been approved and the dredge permit has been drafted and is under final review.) 100% of the 32 individual waterfront property owners are participating in the permit process. **The project has the support of stakeholders from the cities, fisheries groups, environmental groups, and the business communities**. The Portland Harbor Dredge Project is well supported, well conceived, and is poised for construction.

Funding is the last hurdle. The project is estimated at \$30million and \$28million is requested for bond funding with the balance coming from public and private pier and property owners. While federal funding is possible, past experience with grants has demonstrated that such a diverse and unique project does not fit neatly into federal categories for eligibility. The highly competitive RAISE program (previously TIGER and BUILD) with USDOT provides the most likely opportunity for federal funds. In the RAISE program, dredging of berthing resources, however necessary, must compete nationally for funds against larger urban communities requesting public transit, highways and bridges, and safety projects addressing social equity concerns. **Bond funding through the State of Maine may be the only viable option for Portland Harbor's future as a center for fishing and marine commerce.**

Thank you for the Committee's attention and we ask for your support to preserve our working waterfront and the berthing needs of Portland Harbor.
