Project Reports

Luminous Arbor: Three outstanding items discussed – Templeton took photos – Cradock and Lisberger to create page for the artwork on website; Lisberger is managing the order of the plaque – Cameron and Lisberger met on site to determine the size and placement (5.25"x4" horizontal on top of pedestal); Light sensor to be fixed. Lisberger drafted website update with map, press link photos, and description.

Portland Brick: Cradock waiting to hear from artist to confirm transfer of domain before transferring to server.

Conservation:

- **Cleeves:** The remainder of this work is postponed.
Glimpse: Lisberger researched costs for proposed conservation plan and will compile information and give to Jonathan to be put into a formal conservation plan. Lisberger consulted with original installer, Matt St Cyr, regarding the deinstallation, transport, and reinstallation. Question whether this work would be subcontractors under the conservator or if this would be a separate contract requiring quotes/bids. The interim maintenance work was completed in the summer. Lisberger will ask Taggart's opinion regarding the reconnection point at the ground – risks, longevity of materials. The committee deliberated over the timeline and cost for this work. The committee accepted the recommended conservation plan for Glimpse but to moved to postpone conservation to a future time as recommended by the conservator and artist. **[Lisberger, Kirby 7-0 approve]**
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MLK Memorial: No update.

Amethyst: No update.

Congress Square: Fundraising committee has reconvened and will begin fundraising this winter. 100% DD documents were also sent to the PMA including the new curator for contemporary art. Committee discussed timeline and next steps for design development artwork – 6 months beginning in January after fundraising materials completed. Check in with artist focused on fundraising materials.

Subcommittee Reports

Governance/Board Development: Committee reviewed 2016 goals and the public art ordinance. The committee reconfirmed the goals, discussed updates to the strategies in the following ways:

- Possibly create an education subcommittee
- Art in Our Front Yard on hiatus and no longer applicable; Lisberger will ask CTN to finish videos under agreement
- Designate a sculpture of the month, work with Creative Portland to advertise, post video
- Proposal for a music pop-up at sculpture of the month during First Friday or Art in Our Front Yard
- Abdullah can use radio show to promote public art activities; Kirby agree to speak on the show as needed
- Possible collaboration with TempoArts/Portland Trails project
- Improve on multi-cultural/diversity goals

Confirmation of subcommittee members:

- Governance – Lisberger, Kirby
- Communication – Lisberger, Cradock, Crowder, Abdullah, Templeton, Lipton
- Site Selection – Hildreth, Greenwold, Minter, Cradock

Communications: Kirby asked for continuing conversation around events, education in monthly meetings – add to the agenda. Kirby updated that the downtown public artwork is now on the Creative Portland monthly map as well as the sculpture of the month. Little Water Girl was selected for February.

Site Selection:

- **USM Roundabout:** The committee will begin meeting in January with five meetings total. Meetings held as USM and open to the public. Cameron will add committee members to the google drive.

Temporary Art :

- TEMPOArts released a call for proposals with Portland Trails for the summer 2019.
- 2019 Temporary Art review panelists will be Crowder and Lipton.

Other Business:

- Creative Portland is updating the Cultural Plan – a draft was circulated.
