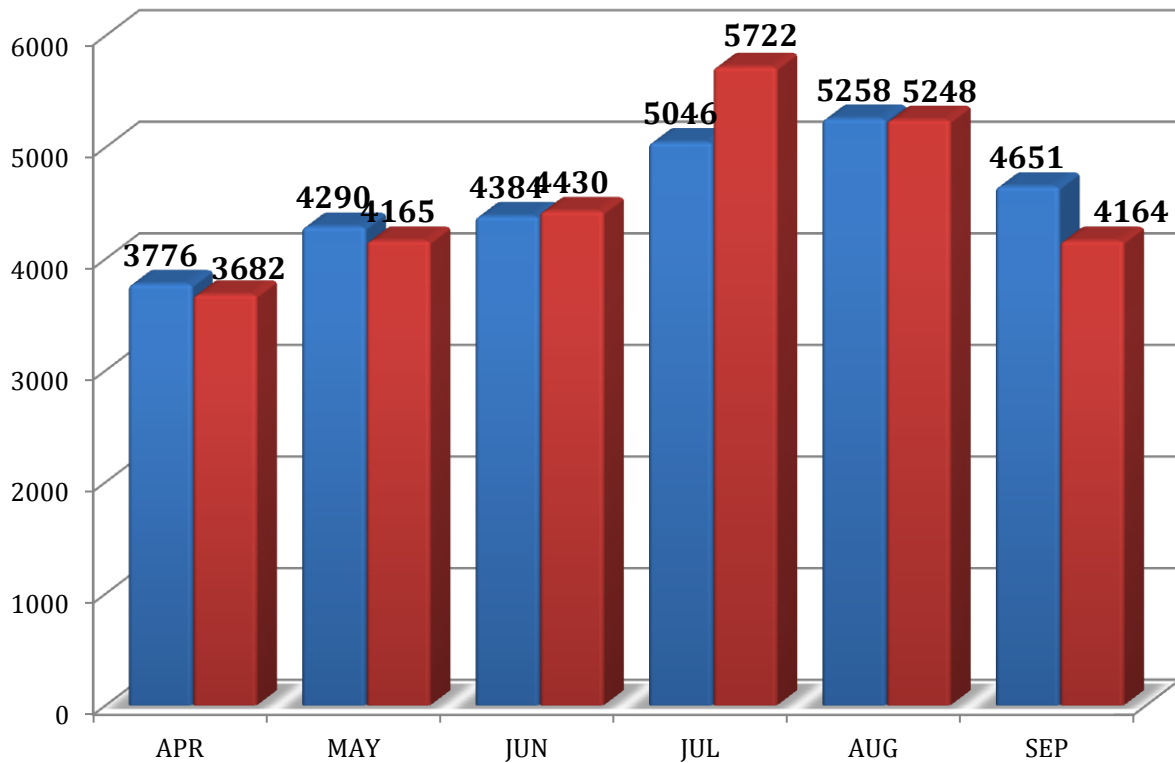

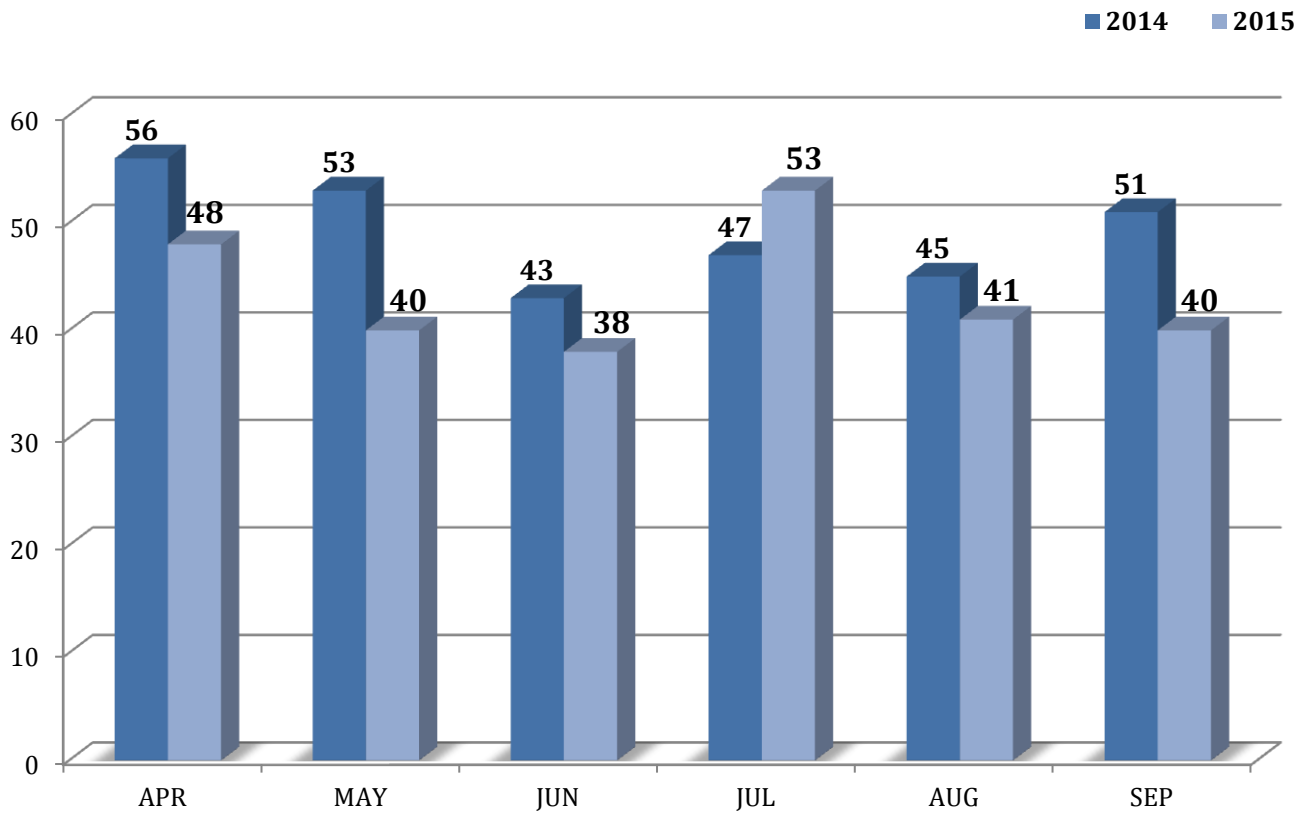

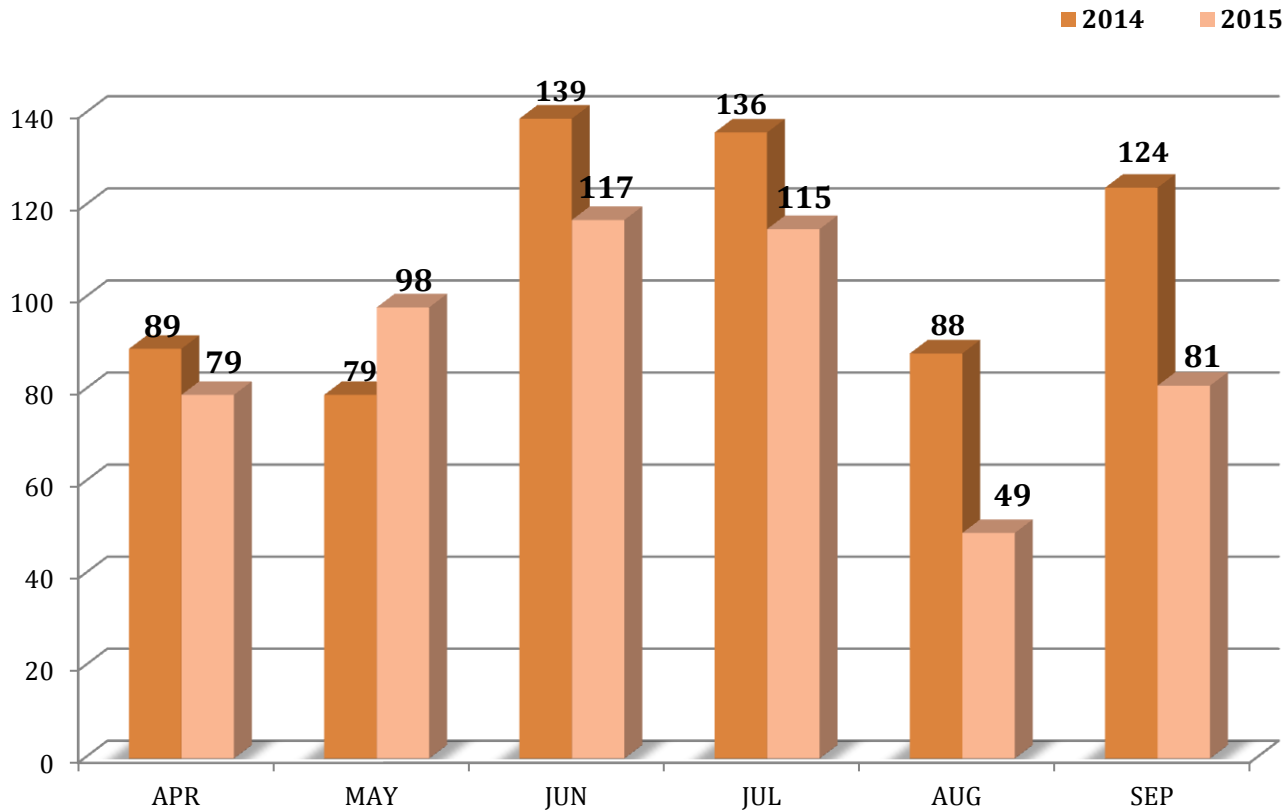

PORTLAND, CITY-WIDE HOME TO STAY HOUSING PLACEMENTS SEPTEMBER 2015



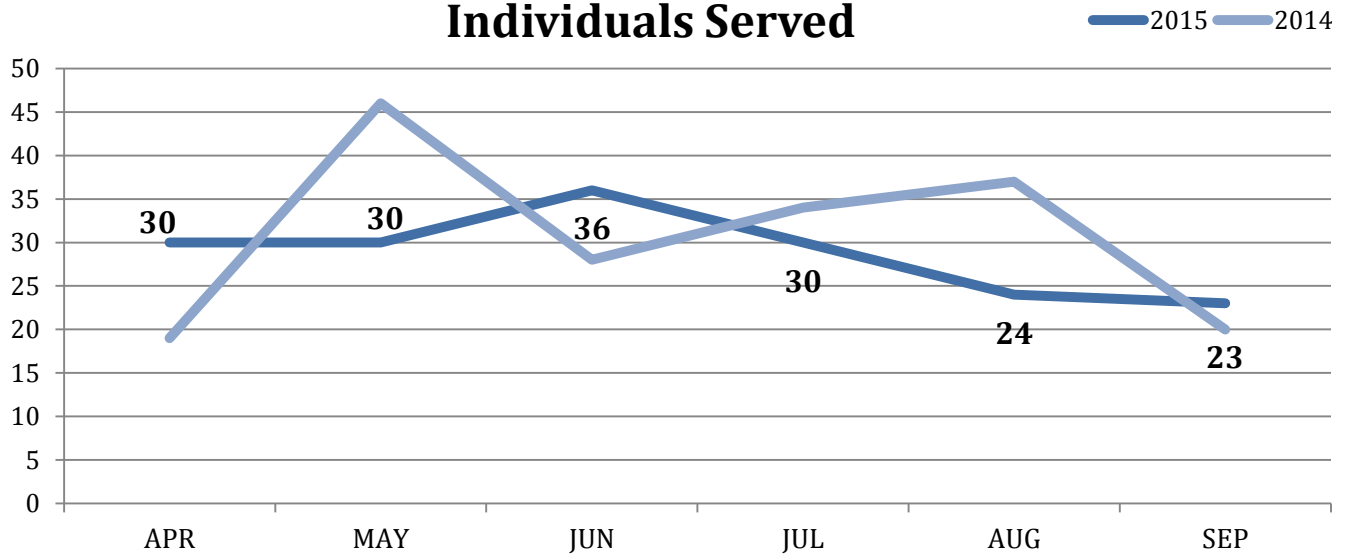

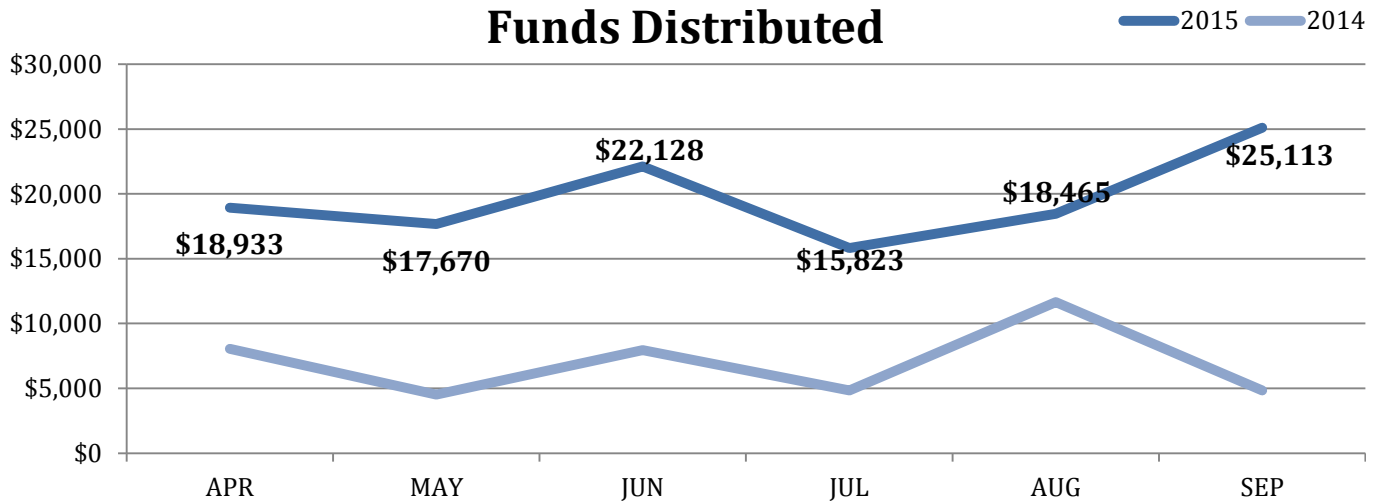
